Good Afternoon,

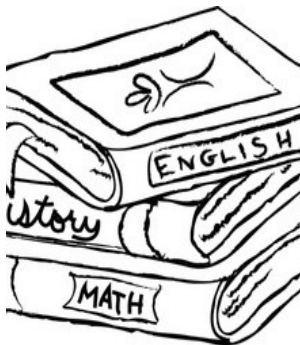
***Grace, Peace and Love to you from our Father in Heaven, Jesus
